- **“Night watch brigade”**: The group will accompany the night watch brigade, made up of 4 agents who check that rules and regulations are respected in drinking establishments
- **“Party guardians”**: The group will accompany the party guardians, a group made up of professionals, volunteers and charity workers whose objectives are prevention and risk reduction, to meet young people in public party spaces in the centre of town.
- **“The bar-bars collective”**: Accompanied by members of the collective, the group will meet managers of drinking establishments invested in the “café culture” approach

II. 10.30–12 pm. one group of 30 to 40 people

- **“The TAN circuit”**: The group will be transported from the centre of town to the party scene at the “Banana Hangar”. The group will be accompanied by prevention officials from TAN, public transporter workers who will help the group understand how public transport is implemented during the night.
- **“Alterminus at AlterCafé”**: The group will be received at the Alter Café, who is invested in the nightlife charter and from midnight, the group will think about the effects of distributing free cocktails to fight against excessive consumption of alcohol.
- **“Risk reduction at the Banana Hangar”**: Members of the working group “banana hangar” - policemen, firemen, city council - explain the process implemented by several partners to reduce risk-taking on the site located on the Loire: eg. transportation, firefighter intervention plan, the prevention stand, coordination
